

MUSLIM MARRIAGE PROCESS

From April 2025, all marriage applications must include supporting documents.



* This process applies to couples who meet the following criteria:

- Groom, bride and wali must be Singapore Citizen or PR with valid Singpass;
- First marriage for groom and bride, and both must be above 21 years old;
- Wali must be biological father and present during solemnisation; and
- Wali must consent to the the solemnisation

1 WALI

- Wali gives consent for marriage
- Biological father is the wali
- Wali will be present during solemnisation

3 SOLEMNISATION DETAILS

Finalise your solemnisation details

- Date, time and venue
- Details of the two witnesses (NRICs/passports and name)
- Maskahwin
- Hantaran



4 SUBMIT APPLICATION



- Requires Singpass and valid email addresses
- Earliest date to solemnise is 21 days after submission of application
- Application will last 150 days from submission date

5 FACE-TO-FACE (F2F) SESSION (BERSAMAMU)

- Book and attend F2F to get to know your Kadi/Naib Kadi
- After attending F2F, verify your F2F online at your marriage application dashboard
- Wait for your Kadi/Naib Kadi to confirm your verification



6 ONLINE DECLARATION



- Sign online declaration after your Kadi/Naib Kadi has confirmed verification of your F2F
- Groom, bride and wali who are eligible* (see eligibility criteria above) will be invited to sign their declaration online using Singpass

7 SOLEMNISATION DAY

The following must be present:

- Groom and Bride
- Wali
- Two witnesses

Documents/Items to be produced:

- NRICs of Groom, Bride and Wali
- NRICs/Passports of 2 witnesses
- Maskahwin
- Hantaran



* ROMM will issue ceremonial certificate and digital marriage certificate to couples with effect from 1 July 2024

MUSLIM MARRIAGE PROCESS

* This process applies to couples who meet the following criteria:

- Solemnisation between Singapore Citizen/PR and foreigner;
- Applicant(s) must have a Singpass; and
- Wali must consent to the solemnisation.

WALI



- Wali gives consent for marriage
- Who can be your wali? In hierarchical order:
 - Father
 - Paternal Grandfather
 - Brother
 - Paternal Uncle

*No skipping of the order. ROMM will require documentary proof (death certificate or doctor's memo to certify illness/mental health) if any of the person listed is skipped.

SUBMIT APPLICATION

- Requires Singpass and valid email addresses
- Earliest date to solemnise is 21 days after submission of application
- Application will last 150 days

FACE-TO-FACE (F2F) SESSION (BERSAMAMU)



- Book and attend F2F to get to know your Kadi/Naib Kadi and establish rapport
- After attending F2F, submit your F2F online via your marriage application dashboard
- Wait for your Kadi/Naib Kadi to verification your attendance

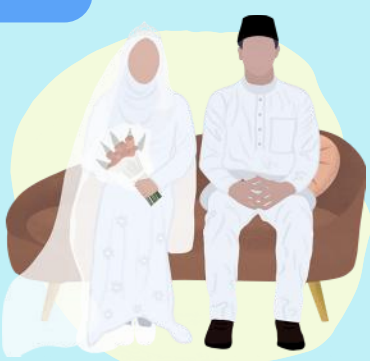
ATTEND APPOINTMENT WITH ROMM

- Groom, bride and wali are to attend appointment in-person at ROMM with the necessary documents (see Step 4)
- Documents must be in original or certified true copy and must be translated into English or Malay if originals are not in English/Malay
- Verify and sign statutory declaration

SOLEMNISATION DAY



The following must be present:

- Groom and Bride
- Wali
- Two witnesses

Documents/Items to be produced:

- NRICs/Passports of Groom, Bride, Wali (if applicable) and 2 witnesses
- Maskahwin
- Hantaran

* ROMM will issue ceremonial certificate and digital marriage certificate to couples with effect from 1 July 2024

Milestones and transformation of a Muslim couple's marriage journey

Up to June 2019

Online marriage application followed by in-person Verification of Documents and Statutory Declaration (VSD) with couples and wali. Once approved, couple can proceed with solemnisation. Couples were also strongly encouraged to attend Marriage Preparation Programme (MPP).



Bersamamu (July 2019)

Besides couples attending MPP, Kadi/Naib Kadi will also support couples in their marriage journey before solemnisation and through the first two years of their marriage lives together. Couples will begin their pre-marriage journey with a Face-to-Face (F2F) meeting with their selected Kadi/Naib Kadi before they can proceed for their solemnisation.



Video-Link Solemnisation (May 2020)

ROMM adopted video-link* technology to allow solemnisations to continue amid the pandemic.

* all parties must be in Singapore.



Online booking of appointment (January 2022)

Prior to January 2022, couples were required to call ROMM's call centre to book their VSD appointment and it would take a few days to confirm the appointment. Couples are now able to book their in-person VSD appointment with ROMM online.



Online Video-Link VSD (January 2022)

Eligible* couples can choose video-link VSD instead of in-person at ROMM. Priority given to wali with mobility issues.

* Couples and wali must be Singapore Citizens/PRs and in Singapore.

Kadi Portal (October 2022)

Launch of Kadi Portal to allow our Kadi/Naib Kadi to manage solemnisations efficiently. They are able to plan their availability and view details of the solemnisation bookings through the calendar. They will receive notifications of new bookings as well as updates to existing ones.

Uploading of documents (October 2022)

Launch of Our Marriage Journey website that would allow couples to upload supporting documents of their marriage application via the dashboard.



Online declaration (September 2023)

Eligible couples do not have to attend in-person appointment with ROMM. All parties (couple and wali) will be able to perform online declaration using their Singpass.

Eligibility criteria:

- Groom, bride and wali must be Singapore Citizens/PRs;
- First marriage for groom and bride and must be above 21 years old;
- Wali must be biological father and present during solemnisation;
- Wali must consent to the solemnisation.



Online booking of F2F (Bersamamu) (September 2023)

Currently, the Kadi/Naib Kadi contacts the couple to set up the F2F appointment and it will take some time to confirm the date. Couples are now able to book online for their F2F session with Kadi/Naib Kadi prior to their solemnisation under the Bersamamu programme.

Kadi Portal enhancement (September 2023)

Kadi portal will be enhanced to :

- Manage F2F bookings
- Verify F2F attendance
- Register solemnisation

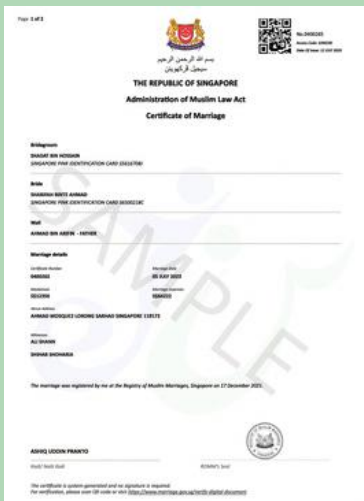

More Convenience and Support for Couples



From 1 July 2024, couples who solemnise and register their marriage with the Registry of Muslim Marriages (ROMM) will receive:



Digital Certificate of Marriage
For easy storage and retrieval



Ceremonial Certificate of Marriage
For commemoration of the special occasion



Important note:

For any changes to the solemnisation details* on the solemnisation day, you need to inform your Kadi/Naib Kadi prior to the start of your ceremony. This may affect the delivery of the digital certificate of marriage. Do take note of the following:



If changes and payment are made online before 7.00am on your solemnisation day

- You will receive the digital certificate of marriage via email once your Kadi/Naib Kadi registers your marriage within 3 working days.
- The changes made to the solemnisation details may not be updated in the ceremonial certificate during the ceremony as it is printed ahead of time.



If changes and payment are not made online by 7.00am on your solemnisation day

- You are required to come to ROMM the next working day to make payment and inform us of the changes to be reflected on your digital certificate of marriage.
- You will receive the digital certificate of marriage via email thereafter.

* Only the following details could be changed and payment of \$15 is required:

- Witnesses' details such as name and NRIC/passport number
- Maskahwin
- Hantaran

Please note that hardcopy certificate of marriage will no longer be issued.
